I want to express my sincere appreciation to all of you who have consistently been so generous in your giving and expressions of love and support provided to our homeless and hungry children not just one month, but each and every month of the year. YOU have made a difference in the life of a child!

Thirty one FBH children recently shared their Stories of Hope in the DB News Journal and all 31 received a special present from someone who read about their life and dreams. A volunteer makes homemade meals for FBH families and delivers to their doorstep not caring about the part of town she is in or the condition of the home. It is amazing to witness the involvement of our youth in supporting those their age who are hurting and hungry such as a 6 year old selling his artwork and donating the money to FBH, a 5<sup>th</sup> grader working to earn money to buy items for residents of Hope House, a teenager using his truck to deliver food bags, and a middle school student volunteering her time to help support the KidsZone students at Pierson. ## **COAMED CLINIC IN PIERSON**

A team of Orlando doctors recently volunteered and visited the San Jose Mission in Pierson to provide much needed well check-ups for local residents. The Food Brings Hope event was made possible by a partnership between FBH and COAMED.

COAMED is a non-profit organization established in 2015 to support under-served communities in the state of Florida and overseas. The COAMED Association members provide preventive, therapeutic, supportive and rehabilitative health care services to individuals living in one of these communities.

The event provided services to Pierson residents many of whom participate in the Adult Literacy Program provided at the Mission by Food Brings Hope and Daytona State College's Adult Continuing Education Department.

Clinic patients received medical examinations, and a pediatrician was on site to provide services to the youth.

### **BUNNELL ELEMENTARY KIDSZONE & FBHONORS ACTIVITIES**

Over the last few months, Bunnell Elementary KidsZone and FBHonors students participated in many interesting and educational activities. These projects ranged from using sample paint strips to decorate a paper bag turkey with feathers featuring multiplication facts to creating Christmas tree structures using gumdrops and toothpicks. In another activity, students were given a single piece of paper and were tasked with making the longest paper chain in 20 minutes.

Students also learned about liquid and density using honey, dish soap, water, oil, and rubbing alcohol in graduated cylinders to determine which was most dense by observing the way the liquids separated and floated on top of each other.

A popular activity among the students was taste testing white and yellow American cheese from four different companies to decide which one the students liked the best. Using a rubric, they ranked them based on criteria such as color, texture, and creaminess and then shared their evaluation and ranking with their peers.
