Together, we set the lofty goal of \$30,000 through donations from customers during the month and then 100% of the sales from the "Day of Giving" at the end of the month. The FBH team is extremely grateful for the dedication and support of Jersey Mike's Subs over the past seven years. Since March 2015, Jersey Mike's has contributed over \$80,000 to FBH.

The act of giving during March was also displayed by students in our various programs. Some students chose to be kind and make cards for lonely senior citizens in a nursing home, others planted a garden to give or provide their herbs and vegetables to the school cafeteria, as well as, to needy families in the community. FBHonors students prepared classroom donation kits to raise money and awareness for children battling leukemia and lymphoma.

Businesses, organizations, volunteers and donors stepped up also to give back to the community by distributing over 300 bags of food, 9 pound hams, school supplies and Covid safety items plus over 600 Easter candy treats and stuffed animals for the children. This Spring Break drive through was held in partnership with A WISH Organization and Mainland High School. One of the highlights of the day was when one gentleman stopped his car, after completing all his stops, came over to me and said, "I appreciate so much what you all are doing for me and my family. Everyone is so happy and smiling as they gave us all our stuff. I want to know how I can be a part of this and help others too."

BASILICA SCHOOL OF ST. PAUL PLANT GARDENS

KidsZone and TeenZone students at Basilica School of St. Paul's recently planted a Hope Garden cinder block proto-type garden project. Students in grades 4-8 helped build cinder block raised gardens on campus. Students calculated how many bricks would be needed, the amount of soil/potting mix needed, and what type of crops to be planted.

Students wanted to grow fresh herbs that can be used in the school cafeteria or even to bag and sell to the school community. This project involved Math,

research into AgriSciences, and creativity on the students' part to make Hope Garden a success. The 8th grade will then guide the 7th grade in building their Cinder block garden, followed by the 6th grade.
